Summary of Proceedings – 16 November 2016

Recommendations from Previous Meetings

- Provide all-weather access at the airport - ongoing item
- Airservices to revisit the RWY 32 RNP approach to provide a more resident friendly outcome.

Airport Developments

Gold Coast Airport General Manager Operations and Service Delivery, Brett Curtis, provided an update on airport operations:

- The Airport has reviewed the delivery program for Project Lift. The terminal construction will now be completed in 2019.
- An appeal has been lodged with the Administrative Appeal Tribunal to review the Minister's decision to approve the ILS MDP. The final hearing is expected to be undertaken in early December. The Group will be advised of the result from the hearing when known.
- Gold Coast Airport has partnered with Volunteering Gold Coast to recruit 33 volunteers to provide assistance within the terminal to the travelling public. The ambassadors will operate on a shift basis, with up to 3 ambassadors on shift covering the hours between 0630 and 1830. The ambassadors commenced last Monday 7 November.
- Stage 1 of the Common Use Passenger Processing System (CUPPS) project has been complete with 25 kiosks and 8 Automatic Bag Drops installed and are currently being operated by Virgin, Tiger and Air New Zealand. Stage 2 works will commence in March 2017 and be completed by mid-2017.
